Helen Alvaré, a Professor of Law at the Antonin Scalia Law School, George Mason University, teaches Family Law, Law and Religion, and Property Law. She received her law degree from Cornell University School of Law and her master's degree in Systematic Theology from the Catholic University of America.

She regularly publishes articles on marriage, parenting, non-marital households, and the First Amendment religion clauses. She serves as faculty advisor to the law school's *Civil Rights Law Journal* and the Latino/a Law Student Association. She is a consulter for the Pontifical Council of the Laity and is an advisor to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. She cooperates with the Permanent Observer Mission of the Holy See to the United Nations as a speaker and delegate to various United Nations conferences concerning women and the family.

In addition to her books and publications in law reviews and other academic journals, Professor Alvaré is a news consultant for ABC and she publishes regularly in news outlets including the *New York Times* and the *Washington Post*. She also speaks at academic and professional conferences in the United States, Europe, Latin America, and Australia.

Prior to joining the faculty of the Scalia Law School, Professor Alvaré taught at the Columbus School of Law at the Catholic University of America; represented the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops before legislative bodies, academic audiences, and the media; and was a litigation attorney for the Philadelphia law firm of Stradley, Ronon, Stevens and Young.
