

From the President

Ash Wednesday is February 17th, and the beginning of Lent is upon us. I would like to give my space over this month to a guest columnist who can help us get ready for the programming themes we will be hearing on AM 1260 The Rock this season, as well as helping us appreciate the urgency of Lenten penance in the face of the signs we see in the world around us. This was written (and you can tell) by Benedictines in Solesmes, France, during the mid-1800s, which was an era not unlike ours in terms of uncertainty and even turmoil:

Although the divine mysteries whereby our Savior wrought our redemption have been consummated, yet are we still sinners: and where there is sin, there must be expiation.

The Apostles, therefore, legislated for our weakness by instituting, at the very commencement of the Christian Church, that the solemnity of Easter should be preceded by a universal fast; and it was only natural that they should have made this period of penance to consist of forty days, seeing that our divine Master had consecrated that number by His own fast. St. Jerome, St. Leo the Great, St. Cyril of Alexandria, St. Isidore of Seville, and others of the holy fathers, assure us that Lent was instituted by the Apostles, although, at the commencement, there was not any uniform way of observing it....

Pope Benedict XIV wrote in 1741: 'The observance of Lent is the very badge of the Christian warfare. By it, we prove ourselves not to be enemies of the cross of Christ. By it we avert the scourges of divine justice. By it we gain strength against the princes of darkness, for it shields us with heavenly help. Should mankind grow remiss in their observance of Lent, it would be a detriment to God's glory, a disgrace to the Catholic religion, and a danger to Christian souls. Neither can it be doubted that such negligence would become the source of misery to the world, of public calamity, and of private woe.' More than two hundred years have elapsed since this solemn warning of the Vicar of Christ was given to the world; and during that time, the relaxation he inveighed against has gone on gradually increasing. How few Christians do we meet who are strict observers of Lent, even in its present mild form.

And must there not result from this ever-growing spirit of immortification, a general effeminacy of character, which will lead, at last, to frightful social disorders? The sad predictions of Pope Benedict XIV are but too truly verified. Those nations, among whose people the spirit and practice of penance are extinct, are heaping against themselves the anger of God, and provoking his justice to destroy them by one or other of these scourges civil discord, or conquest. In our own country there is an inconsistency, which must strike every thinking mind: the observance of the Lord's day, on the one side; the national inobservance of the days of penance and fasting, on the other. The first is admirable, and, if we except puritanical extravagances, bespeaks a deep-rooted sense of religion; but the second is one of the worst presages for the future. The word of God is unmistakable: unless we do penance, we shall perish (cf. Lk. 13:3). But if our ease-loving and sensual generation were to return, like the Ninevites, to the long-neglected way of penance and expiation, who knows but that the arm of God, which is already raised to strike us, may give us blessing and not chastisement?"

Thank you for your support of AM 1260 The Rock! May God bless all our families in Cleveland and throughout the universal Church during this Lent.


Annual Contribution Statements for 2020

Set Your Mind to Things That **Are Above**

In the first months of this New Year, some pray for good health, prosperity, success, happiness, contentment, and a



In the last part of the 18th century, many of you may be aware of the French Revolution in which the public intention was stated to "destroy the Catholic Church." To accomplish this, the rebels published a number of books wherein they derided and blasphemed everything that is venerable and sacred to the Christian faith. They denied the Divinity of Christ. They exalted vice as virtue and placed the happiness of humanity in the gratification of carnal lust. Their efforts were successful as eventually the churches were profaned, and altars demolished. The images of saints were defaced and those priests who did not deny the faith were put to death. The removal of Catholic institutions and their personnel, however, simply forced religious worship into the private sphere and increased the involvement of the laity, trends that would also mark the religious revival that took place in France in the 19th century. The Church endures.

Consider the Catholics of Ireland in the middle of the 17th century, at the time of the Irish Rebellion and the institution of Penal Laws. The practice of the Catholic religion was strictly prohibited. Catholics were deprived of their churches. Convents and monasteries were secularized. Bishops and priests were banished or put to death. There was not a single Catholic school throughout the country and parents were forbidden to have their children instructed and educated in foreign countries. The property of Catholics was confiscated, and they were only permitted to rent their own land. The oppression lasted for three hundred years. One might think that the Catholic faith would have entirely perished in Ireland, but the faithful Irish remained firm and immovable in their faith, trusting God throughout all of their trials. The Church endures.

We can take consolation in that fact that the Catholic Church can never perish, for Christ has promised that the gates of hell shall never prevail against her. We should not worry about the Church. However, each of our souls may be in jeopardy as it can be easy for one to lose his faith, despite reception of the Sacraments and Catholic education for many years as so many others have. We cannot take our faith for granted. Even in the face of persecution, we must continue to remain faithful, calling upon the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Saint Peter to protect us.

AM 1260 The Rock: Reaching the Other Side of the Globe



AM 1260 The Rock is reaching souls not only in Northeast Ohio, but in remote corners of the world. We regularly hear from people who have tuned into The Rock in Scandinavian countries, where the signal can reach with surprising strength and clarity. The messages come from DXers, people who tune into and identify distant radio stations as a hobby. It's popular in northern Sweden, Finland, and Norway where AM signals from North America land after crossing the North Pole.

It's the hobby that got me interested in broadcasting when I started DXing from the attic of our Cleveland home in about 1962! Unlike my crude setup, with a copper wire attached to a transistor radio, today's DXers in Scandinavia often have elaborate arrays with which to hone into even the faintest of signals.

"Hello! It is with great pleasure that I report reception of your station WCCR Cleveland on 1260 kHz," is how the welcome emails often start. The DXer then provides details of the time and date they tuned into The Rock, usually attaching an audio file as verification. They include what kind of equipment they used, mentioning antennas which can be over half a mile long!

These hobbyists are serious. A number have reported camping out in remote cabins 200 miles north of the Arctic Circle, just to get the best chance of capturing radio signals from as far away as possible. One DXer told us of his 12-hour trek north to Lapland from his home outside Helsinki. "Our setup consisted of 4 Italian Perseus software receivers and the antenna system of fourteen 1,000-meter long wires hanging on the branches of trees," he matter-of-factly related. "Because of the long antennas and

favourable atmospheric conditions, we were able to pick up your signal."

DXers must have confirmation before they can list a distant radio station in their collection. "Hearing your station was such an astonishing experience for us that we would greatly appreciate your reply to confirm," wrote another distant listener. In the days before email, radio stations would send confirmation in the form of a "QSL Card" in the mail. Today, a verifying email reply counts the same.

One Swedish DXer who captured The Rock's signal added WCCR to his list of now 3,290 radio stations he pulled in from 208 countries over the last 45 years. The hobby has enthusiasts all over the world, and they regularly share on dedicated websites stories of their long hours of attentive

listening and even of mounting DXpeditions in search of prized radio signals.

While it may sound inhospitable to us, venturing to the parts of the globe with the clearest radio reception seems to be on the to-do list of the most serious DXers. As a Norwegian listener to The Rock told us, "The north of Norway is a very favorable location with its polar nights and a shortcut across the Arctic." Now if we could only pick up The Rock on our car radios in Strongsville.
