Notes from the Director

Where does the time go? Here we are, in 2024, now in our 9th year of broadcasting Catholic radio to Northeast Ohio and beyond, 24/7.

I am often asked about ratings and numbers of listeners, etc. I can tell you we are growing both in numbers of listeners and donors. I know this from the calls we get, the new donors during our pledge drives, and the increasing numbers in our database. Yes, the pandemic set us back from participating in events and visiting parishes, but we are (hopefully) past that and continuing to engage in events and parishes throughout our listening area.

We also are continuing to evaluate our programming (as is EWTN) to make sure we are providing quality Catholic content. We are pleased that EWTN is now providing the popular podcasts “Bible in a Year” and “Catechism in a Year” with Fr. Mike Schmitz, which air daily at 10 PM.

In 2023, we added “A Moment for your Marriage,” from Marriages of Grace, reflections from the 2nd graders at St. Mary Chardon about First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion, additional versions of the afternoon children’s rosary from local Catholic schools, and more content on our “Wisdom From the Rock” podcast.

We also made improvements to our soundproofing in our studio, replaced our studio computers which control all our programming, and replaced our Emergency Alert System unit, as well as completed our Ohio Association of Broadcasters Inspection Program. ***Thanks to your generous support, we have been able to do all of this!***

In November, the board of St. Peter The Rock Media and the staff of AM 1260 The Rock revised our Strategic Plan for the next 3 years. Our previous plan was drafted in 2019, just before the pandemic. Amazingly, despite so many obstacles, we completed many of the items in the original plan, including the purchase of our new transmitter.

But we want to do more – we ***need*** to do more. We cannot become complacent in preaching the Gospel. We want more people to know Catholic radio is here. We want to provide more top-quality content from local voices. We are planning significant projects at our transmission site to maintain and improve our current broadcast signal, while being attentive to opportunities to expand our reach beyond our current coverage area.

All of this will take more resources, both human and capital. We need to invite more people to participate in the work of this apostolate as volunteers, listeners and donors. With increases in marketing, staffing and capacity, we can tell even more souls about the reason for our hope – Jesus Christ.

Thank you for what you make possible each and every day through your support of this apostolate. Know of our prayers for you, and continue to pray for us, that we may discern God’s call in how HE wants us to steward this apostolate, for HIS glory and the salvation of souls.

Tips for a Great Lent

Any of you who have known me for some time have heard my litany of things I have given up for Lent throughout my life: television; music; red meat; all flesh meat; table salt; candy and sweets; desserts; my pillow; cream in my coffee; lunch. Some of these sacrifices date back to when I was an idealistic young man and so desired to live like a saint. The problem is that there are many things that interfere with our desire to live a life of sanctity such as work, family responsibilities, and health limitations. While I believe that everyone should do some kind of penitential sacrifice for Lent, I also acknowledge that it is not always practical. So, what can we do to make the Holy Season of Lent a great one? Here are a few suggestions...

- **Speak less and listen more.** When we consciously make the effort to listen to those around us and not feel as if we have to talk incessantly, we will find a greater peace to settle upon our soul. When we intentionally listen to others, we learn more about them and find our connection to them grow and strengthen. Do you have strained relations with another person, whether a family member or co-worker? Try listening to them more than speaking to them.
- **Take a “technology fast day” once a week in which you do not engage with any modern technology such as computers, smartphones, streaming services, etc.** We do not always realize how often we use communication technology as a crutch when we are bored or unhappy. In the end, it always makes you more bored and more unhappy! A technology fast can be one of the most refreshing things you can do.
- **Develop an attitude of gratitude and write a thank-you note to one person each day of Lent.** Too often, we find it easier to complain rather than praise. Change that mindset by first, acknowledging God and offering prayers of thanksgiving to Him and then follow up with a note or email to another to thank them for some way they have helped you.
- **Refrain from gossip and detraction, asking yourself if you would say these things if that person were present.** We often do not realize how often we engage in talking about others until we make ourselves aware of it. Abstaining from gossip is a good practice to develop, and you will find your own relations with others will improve greatly.



- **Watch and listen to only Catholic religious programming (hint: EWTN and AM 1260The Rock!).** At the end of Lent, you will not miss the daily news or other mindless options. How much time is wasted just flipping through channels or scrolling Netflix looking for a movie to watch?
- **Pray the Stations of the Cross daily.** Walk the *Via Dolorosa* with Christ. You do not always need to pray the full Stations if you have a limited time schedule. There are abbreviated versions that help to provide the message of the sufferings of Christ. Or you can pray a different version of the Stations each day.
- **Begin a Spiritual Journal in which you document your own prayers and conversation with God.** I cannot recommend this practice enough as I have found it to be significant in my own spiritual growth. Writing down my prayers each day helps to witness patterns of spiritual highs and lows as well as makes my communication with God more intentional.
- **Try praying only one set of Mysteries of the Holy Rosary during the Holy Season of Lent.** I usually stick with the Sorrowful Mysteries every day and have found that it really helps me to enter more deeply into each mystery. By the time Easter rolls around, I am excited to pray the Glorious Mysteries!

Most of all, make the Most of the Holy Season of Lent. We do not know when it may be our last one here in this world. Be assured of my prayers for you during this sacred time.

Dive Deep Into the Catechism and the Bible on The Rock

The Fr. Mike Schmitz's series "The Catechism in a Year" and "The Bible in a Year" have come to The Rock! You can follow along with Fr. Schmitz's wonderful exposés of the Catechism and the Bible right here on The Rock every day at 10:00 PM.

I listened to Fr. Schmitz's podcasts over the last two years. It was a good journey through the Bible the first year and the Catechism the second year. Father reads a passage from the Bible or a section of the Catechism each day and does a great job of explaining the passage or section and making it meaningful to your own personal life.

"The Catechism in a Year" is a great resource for learning about our Catholic Faith and how we should live it. It starts with teaching us about man's innate ability to know there is a God and how God reveals Himself to man. It then breaks open the Creed, our profession of faith, and unfolds for us the fullness of what we are really saying we believe when we recite each statement. Fr. Schmitz dives into it even further and makes everything easily understandable. You will pray the Creed with more meaning than you ever did before. As Father goes through the Catechism you will dive into the Liturgy, the Sacraments, how we should live our life, the Ten Commandments and how we should pray. Let's take a quick look at praying. When we say the Our Father we probably don't give a lot of thought to every word we are saying. Yet the Catechism says, "The Lord's Prayer 'is truly the summary of the whole gospel.'" For example, what does it mean to hallow God's name? An insight that Fr. Schmitz gives us is this: "Asking the Father that His name be made holy (hallowed) draws us into His plan of loving kindness for the fullness of time." Wow, did you ever think of that?

"The Bible in a Year" is an in-depth presentation of the Bible in the same way. We find out how God created, and why did He create us. A tidbit from Fr. Schmitz on why He created us: "He (God) wasn't lonely, He didn't need someone to do work for Him, in a plan of sheer goodness He freely created man, human beings, to make him share in His own Blessed Life." Father takes you through the whole story of how evil came into the world and God's loving work to bring man back into a loving relationship with Him. He goes through how God brings Himself back into man's life little by little until we reach the full magnificence of God's saving us by His becoming human like us and redeeming us through His life and Sacrifice. A life and Sacrifice that heals us from our iniquity and makes it possible for us to share in His own Blessed Life again!

In all honesty I cannot say I remember everything, or even most of every detail, that Fr. Schmitz teaches in "The Catechism in a Year" and "The Bible in a Year," but after going through them, I have a much greater appreciation of the wonder of our God and the great richness of our Faith.

What is that pattern?

No, the computers haven't taken over our publications (yet). What you're seeing is a special kind of code recognizable by your smartphone through the camera called a quick-response code or "QR code" for short. Together with a service called Linktree, this code makes it easier for anyone with a smartphone to find our digital resources just by scanning it. Let me explain.

A printed website address can be tedious to retype into your smartphone. With this QR code, all you need to do is open your camera and point it at the code. As long as some features of your phone are not disabled, like "Google Lens," your phone will detect the code and a little link to our Linktree page will pop up on the screen.

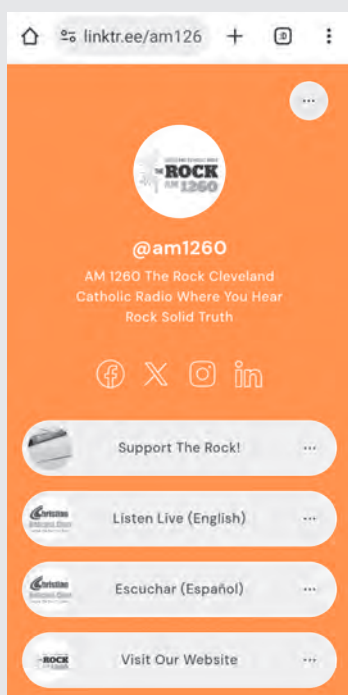
When you follow that link (linktr.ee/am1260) you'll find a stack of links that take you to our home page, social media, donation page, programming schedule, online listening, and even links to our mobile apps for Android or Apple. The QR code makes it easy for people to find many of our digital resources all at once without ever typing in an address or search term!

You may be thinking "I already know where your website is and I've downloaded your app, why would I need this?" We love that you're taking advantage of our online resources, but some people out there still don't even know Cleveland has Catholic radio! We want anyone who sees our print materials to have an easy time finding what AM 1260 The Rock offers.

We also want sharing AM 1260 The Rock to be easier for you. If you keep this QR code handy, or even keep an image of it on your phone (an image is pinned to the top of our Facebook page), you can easily share our digital resources with your friends and neighbors just by letting them point their camera at it.

So, when you see the QR code in our print media, don't take it as a sign of a robotic uprising. Instead, take it as a sign that we're trying to make our programming and resources more accessible to you!

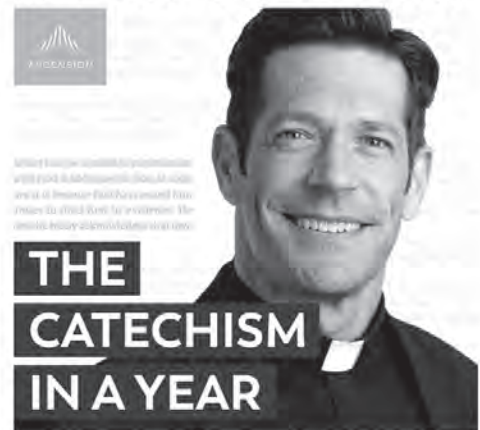
